

Train to Gain Minimum Level of Performance reporting for the academic year 2008/09

Guidance Notes

What are Minimum Level of Performance Reports?

The Minimum Level of Performance (MLP) report for a Train to Gain provider shows whether the provision is above or below a success rate threshold of 65%. Where the provision is above the threshold it is shown in green and where below it is shown in red.

What is the purpose of Minimum Level of Performance?

Minimum Level of Performance (MLP) reports are used to identify and manage underperformance and inform the commissioning process for the LSC.

Who are they used by?

MLP reports are available for each provider who submits ILR data for Train to Gain provision for 2008/09. The reports are published through Provider Gateway. The LSC also use these reports to identify and manage areas of underperformance.

What does the MLP report show?

The report has a summary section of success rates followed by success rates and number of leavers for Sector Subject Areas (SSA) at Tier 1 and Tier 2 for each geographical area.

The categories of qualifications used are:-

- Foundation Learning Tier
- Skills for Life
- Full Level 2 including FE NVQs
- Full Level 3 including FE NVQs
- Other Train to Gain Qualifications including FE NVQs
- An overall success rate

The summary section on page 1 shows:

- percentage success rates for 2008/09 for Train to Gain categories of qualifications and an overall success rate:
 - for All Regions
 - for each Region
 - for each Local Authority (LA)
- the number of leavers not allocated to a LA section because the delivery location postcode is outside England, unknown or not

supplied. These leavers are included in the summary for All Regions but not in any regional or LA summary.

For the success rates by SSA the geographical area is determined by the Delivery Location Postcode (field A23) from the ILR and the section will be repeated as follows:

- for All Regions if there are learners in more than one region. If all learners are in one region there will be no All Regions level summary as this would be the same as the regional level
- for each region
 - if there are learners in more than one LA
 - if all learners are in one LA area and there are fewer than 10 leavers in 2008/09
- for each LA where there are no fewer than 10 learner aims for 2008/09. If there are fewer than 10 learner aims that area will not appear on the summary report. Learners associated with those aims will be included in the regional summary and All Regions.

How often are they produced?

Minimum Level of Performance reports are available in early December following the final ILR submissions for 2008/09.
